"Queen of the Ring" is inspired by Jeff Leen's Pulitzer Prize-winning book, chronicling the true story of Mildred Burke, the first million-dollar female athlete in history. Millie, a young single mother defies societal norms by becoming a professional wrestler during a time when female wrestling was illegal in most of the U.S. Starting her career by competing against men at carnivals, she builds an impressive record and paves the way for women's wrestling to gain acceptance.

Director: Ash grew up in a single parent household, never having met his father but knowing who he was and having his last name. He chose to pursue music first as an artist, touring in a band and teaching himself the business through a DIY lifestyle. Using all the knowledge he learned from the road, he started his own record label. Sumerian Records has now become one of the top independents in the world for rock and alternative music, with several Grammy nominations and record setting Billboard chart metrics for the hard rock genre. Sumerian recently celebrated a historic achievement with the first Grammy nomination in the history of the Recording Academy for a solo female artist in the "Best Metal Performance" category, featuring avant-garde singer Poppy.



Ash Avildsen's first feature film, "American Satan," won several awards on the festival circuit before being distributed by Miramax. The film had a theatrical release and was subsequently picked up by Showtime, where it developed a growing cult following. Ash expanded on this success by writing and directing the limited series spin-off, "Paradise City."

Director's Statement: Storytelling has always been my greatest passion, and "Queen of the Ring" represents a culmination of my journey both personally and professionally. At the age of 34, I finally met my father, acclaimed director John G. Avildsen, known for iconic films such as "Rocky" and "The Karate Kid." Building a beautiful bond with my father as an adult was lifechanging, deeply influencing my approach to storytelling and imbuing my work with a profound sense of purpose and authenticity. Growing up without a father defined me in my youth, but becoming best friends with him later in life has been transformative.

This time he comes in with his directorial debut in which he also has a significant role. Anne-Marie Johnson plays Joanne, a complicated person with lots in the rearview mirror that she doesn't appear to be pulling away from. Harley Jane Kozak plays Joanne's sister, Lynnie, in a demanding role. There are some season vets in the cast as well. Johnson had roles in the TV series IN THE HEAT OF THE NIGHT, 118 episodes as Althea Tibbs (they called her Mrs. Tibbs, jk), and on JAG. Alan Rosenberg (LAST TEMPTATION OF CHRIST, LA Law, Cybill), Shari Belafonte (THE PLAYER, Hotel...and of course, Harry), Erika Alexander (GET OUT, AMERICAN FICTION and BLACK LIGHTNING) and Clancy Brown (THE SHAWSHANK REDEMPTION, NIGHTMARE ON ELM STREET, COWBOYS & ALIENS), usually plays someone evil, gets a reprieve here as Riz the director auditioning Joanne.

Director: Marty Grey Gottlieb was born and raised in Brooklyn, NY before heading to Boulder, CO to play football and an inning or two of baseball for the Buffaloes. After graduating, he returned to Brooklyn and worked in a paper converting factory making paper lace doilies, hence the name of his production company, DOILYBOY. But it was a means to an end once Marty started working as an actor.

His first feature film was THE NATURAL and from there came regular work on television in mostly one hour dramas like NYPD BLUE, ER, JAG, THE X-FILES, COLD CASE, BONES, LIFE and many others. But there was

always an itch to do more. The stage was a great place and Marty was honored with a Los Angeles Drama-Logue award for best actor in FRIENDS, but something was still missing. Like many actors, he started writing and eventually was able to direct a TV pilot, ON AND ON, from his own script. Some years later he co-wrote and co-starred in the award-winning feature film ABOUT FIFTY and now, THE ADDICTION OF HOPE marks his first feature film as a writer/director/producer/actor.

It's the year 2147, men are sterile due to a virus, leaving humankind almost extinct. Tania, a biologist, is trying to inseminate herself to prevent this from happening with the help of an Al system called VIDA. Things take a turn when Azarias, one of the last men and a traveler with a dark past, suddenly appears.

Winner of The Fantastic Pavilion Award at Cannes 2023 and selected for the Big Screen competition in Rotterdam, this dystopian film coming from the Caribbean (a first from the region) is reminiscent of CHILDREN OF MEN and MOON but with a unique flavor of its own. 




CATHY MORIARTY

Director's Statement: The film is born from the life of my best friend Alberto (Beto) and his experiences as an undocumented immigrant. Despite our longstanding friendship since middle school, I was unaware of Beto's undocumented status and the constant fear of deportation he lived with until high school. The introduction of DACA in 2012 offered Beto temporary relief from this fear, allowing him to work legally in the US.

However, in 2016, when DACA's existence was threatened, Beto and I half-jokingly considered marriage as a desperate solution. It was a stark reminder that Beto, as American as myself, faced the possibility of being sent back to a country he barely remembered. This period of uncertainty and anxiety led me to begin writing "The Compatriots," not only as a personal outlet but also to spark conversation about immigration issues.

Through learning about Dreamers – undocumented Americans brought here as children – I realized the depth of their predicament: trapped in a system offering no clear path to citizenship. This film became a personal mission to shed light on the struggles of approximately 3.6 million people in the US who, despite being integral parts of American society, live in constant fear of deportation.

Despite widespread support for granting Dreamers permanent status, political action remains elusive. This film questions whether the lack of progress is due to the issue's low priority in political agendas or a lack of personal connection among most Americans.

"The Compatriots" aims to bridge this gap. While the character of Javi, loosely based on Beto, differs in many aspects, he represents the everyday challenges faced by undocumented individuals. My hope is for the audience to see Javi as a friend, to empathize with his plight, and to be inspired to advocate for policy changes that provide security and permanence for the millions like him in this country.

Lastly, reflecting on my own heritage as a descendant of immigrants who fled antisemitism in the 1920s, I recognize the importance of America's identity as a nation of immigrants. "The Compatriots" is a tribute to this heritage and a call to support all who seek a better life on these shores.







Director: A graduate of Kyiv National University of Theater, Cinema, and Television, Roman has directed short films, documentaries, music videos and the feature film Volcano (2018), which premiered at the Karlovy Vary International Film Festival, screened at more than 50 festivals worldwide (including FLIFF), and won 12 awards, including the Shevchenko National Prize, the highest state prize of Ukraine for works of culture and the arts.



Roman also works as an art director of the DocuDays UA International Human Rights Documentary Film Festival and has been a member of the selection committee for the Ukrainian submissions to the Academy Awards since 2019.

Director's Statement: For me, cinema is a way of exploring the world. I've always been fascinated by and drawn to the south of Ukraine, which is not so well-described in literature or film; it's a sort of no man's land between Crimea and mainland Ukraine.

I grew up there. I grew up in a family of journalists in the '90s. The reality was quite grotesque and I grew up with it, witnessing how news could be created, invented. I always wanted to make a film about this news cycle in the Ukrainian provinces.

The Editorial Office is a metaphor, full of modern myths and obscurities, but it also shows real things that happened to real people. The people who made it and acted in it have a connection to the place and the past of southern Ukraine. They were all affected by the chaos before the war.

Many of the places we filmed no longer exist. They were destroyed, flooded, or burned down. The fates of many people in the film are unknown. Some left the country with their families; some turned out to be collaborators and fled to Russia. But most chose to stay and resist the invaders.

This was challenging at times, but also very gratifying when ideas were evolving through collaboration. Most of our crew were quite young and passionate and eager to prove themselves.

I'm honored to tell Lilly's story and I hope we inspire people all over the world who will see themselves in her and muster the courage to do the right thing.


Director's Statement: High school was a battle for me; having been diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder at the age of 12, I was always surrounded with the notion that I was somehow "different." I could never deeply connect with my peers, afraid of being seen as awkward. I was seeing friends starting romantic relationships and hosting parties, while I was stuck in my bedroom making videos.

One morning, during my junior year of high school in Florida, I was riding to school in a depressive haze, earphones plugged, when I suddenly pictured a scene from a film with this exact concept. I instantly thought to myself: "I could make something really special out of this!" I was tired of seeing modern-day coming-of-age films made by much older directors with no knowledge of my current generation. I also knew it was possible to make a heartfelt coming-of-age drama with a low budget, which further compelled me in wanting to make the film as soon as possible.

I spent the first three months of the COVID-19 pandemic writing the script, loosely based on experiences I'd had in high school. I then spent another year pitching it to everyone and anyone I could find with even the slightest connection to the film industry, with little to no success. Then, through complete coincidence, I bumped into a series of producers through mutual connections. Those connections eventually snowballed, and I suddenly found myself in the director's chair within less than a year.

In writing The Midway Point, I explored themes of loneliness and alienation, both being important themes within the digital age, and something which I felt was underrepresented in stories featuring Generation Z. So much of our generation is surrounded by a constant sea of noise, disruption, and mistrust of the world, that I felt compelled to make a story featuring characters who, despite all the odds, find a way out into a better world.

David's first film, "Stampila" (The Stamp), chronicles the fictional overthrow of a real Moldovan oligarch, filmed on location in Moldova while the real oligarch was still in power.

Director's Statement: Moldova is the poorest country in Europe. It was controlled for years by a powerful oligarch known as "The Puppet Master." In 2014, The Puppet Master and his associates looted over a billion dollars from the Moldovan treasury. This is the largest public theft in modern European history.

In 2018, The Puppet Master was at the height of his power. He controlled Moldova's executive branch, parliamentary majority, and most of the country's media. He even hired American political advisors to help him keep power. (One of his advisors went on to work for President Trump as Director of National Intelligence). The Puppet Master was both well-connected and above the law.

I personally believe that oligarchy (rule by a corrupt few) is the greatest threat to human freedom. I first experienced oligarchy 20 years ago when I was a Peace Corps volunteer in Kyrgyzstan (another ex-Soviet Republic controlled by an oligarch). I lived through the bloodless Kyrgyz "Tulip Revolution," and watched from my village as the people rose up and seized power from the oligarchs controlling their country. From that experience, I learned that oligarchs can only stay in power as long as people are afraid of them. Without fear, they will fall.

We wanted to film these beige structures the way Terrence Malick films at sunset.

The story of legendary 1920's New Orleans dancers, two Jewish sisters and glittering globetrotters who fled antisemitism in Hungary in 1922 to blaze their own trail as contortionist acrobatic performers. They rose to international stardom and danced through every war before retiring to New Orleans, where they became recluses, painting their creole cottage top to bottom with magnificent polka dots. After they died, their neighbor found thousands of costumes in their home, which she then sold in a yard sale that last 5 years. Their story has inspired countless artists, who have created award-winning plays, dance tributes, paintings and poetry based on the extraordinary story of these sisters.

Director's Statement: One winter night, I woke from a dream knowing what I must do: tell the story of Nita & Zita. Why? Two reasons: 1. The story was a wildfire in my soul, burning with the message that the story of the sisters must not be forgotten. 2. The story would be a love letter to my soulmate and dance partner Kim, who had died in 2018. Our "Nita Zita" years were our golden years together, and telling the story of these sisters was my way of reliving our Royal Palace days, days of wine and roses, poetry and cartwheels, wild parties, winking sequins, stage lights, and quiet nights together.

Very little was known about these Jewish Hungarian sisters, in fact, no one even knew if they were really sisters. What was known was the myths: they were glittering globetrotters who danced their way around the world before settling in New Orleans and becoming reclusive eccentrics. They died alone and are buried in the pauper's section of the Hebrew Rest Cemetery, the only attendees at their services was their neighbor and the Rabbi. Their story could have ended there, but it did not.



PLAYING THE CHANGES - Tracking Darius Brubeck Florida Premiere

Playing the Changes shows the social impact of jazz music, by telling the story of jazz pianist Darius Brubeck (born in 1947), the eldest son of legendary jazz musician Dave Brubeck. People quite often see him as 'the son of' but he has used this distinction with idealism. This story examines why and how jazz had a transformative role in different types of societies such as Poland and South Africa and tracks Darius Brubeck's involvement in both. Not only by embracing it - but also carrying on his father legacy in his own social, educational and musical way.

The film is so much more than a biography of Darius. It has tremendous historical impact as it illustrates the post WWII environment, communism and the Iron Curtain. It shifts to South Africa and is eye opening detailing Darius and his wife Cathy's unique contribution to the anti-Apartheid effort.

The film is filled with wonderful archival footage and photographs, not only of the Brubeck family but society, here and abroad. Oh, and of course, music, confirming Dave Brubeck's genius and that the apple doesn't fall far from the tree.

Director: Michiel grew up in front of the television and developed a broad taste in film. He decided to make films for himself. It led him to the Utrecht School of the Arts where he experimented with different genres and narratives.

In his 3rd year he went to Costa Rica to film a jazz documentary called Un Mecato on the life of Robin J. Blakeman. Robin is an English jazz musician who moved to Costa Rica to develop his love for Latin Jazz.

Michiel later made a drama film called Papier Hier, about a character called Holle Bolle Gijs, a boy who is eternalized as a trash can in fairy tale-themed theme park. The film was a fairy parable to educate children with social skills. The film revolves around neglect, fat shaming and karma.

Michiel then made a film about his youth. He wrote and directed Steven Caught a Star. A 'broken home' movie about a boy who grows up with divorcing parents, inspired by his childhood experience. He then made another jazz doc focusing on the life of a Ukrainian jazz vibraphonist living and working in Russia.


Director's Statement: The first time I met Darius was in London in 2016. I was there to film a promo for a documentary that I wanted to make about the Jazz Ambassadors program. I was an admirer of Darius' father's music and when I shook his hand, I even thought: this is the son of the man who made Take Five, Rondo a la Turk and Unsquare Dance, among others. I also discovered that Darius was an impressive pianist when I listened to Years Ago on Spotify, but Darius' life story in South Africa was completely unknown to me. I was mesmerized by our conversations about his and Cathy's dedication to establish Jazz Studies at the University of Kwa-Zulu Natal (then University of Natal) during the apartheid- era, and realized how this resonates with the life of his father Dave.

To me it feels as if Darius wanted to make his mark by doing something different in the jazz world. When I interviewed jazz lovers in Poland, I realized that everyone spoke about Dave, but nobody spoke about Darius. Many films have been made about Dave, but the story of Darius has not yet been told. I want to change that with this documentary.



Cree filmmaker Neil Diamond and Catherine Bainbridge (Rumble: The Indians Who Rocked the World) team up again for the followup to their award-winning documentary Reel Injun. Diamond travels to the corners of Turtle Island and across the Atlantic to dig into the world's historical fascination with Indigenous Peoples. From fashion designer Isaac Mizrahi drawing inspiration from Nanook of the North to the Carlisle Indian Industrial School's impact on the NFL, Diamond assembles a compelling collage packed with pop-culture references. Examples of appropriation are revisited by Indigenous scholars, artists and community members, who are revitalizing their cultures and dispelling the myths and lack of understanding that have persisted for more than a century. Directors: Neil Diamond is a Cree-Canadian filmmaker based in Montreal, Quebec, Canada, born and raised in Waskaganish, Quebec. Working with Rezolution Pictures, Diamond has directed the documentary films Reel Injun, The Last Explorer, One More River, Heavy Metal: A Mining Disaster in Northern Quebec and Cree Spoken Here, along with three seasons of DAB IYIYUU, a series for the Aboriginal Peoples Television Network about Cree elders.

In the 2008 docudrama The Last Explorer, Diamond explored the story of his great-uncle George Elson, a Cree guide who helped to map Labrador as part of an ill-fated 1903 expedition with Leonidas Hubbard and Dillon Wallace, and a return voyage in 1905 with Hubbard's widow Mina Hubbard.

As of April 2011, Diamond is developing a project with Inuit filmmaker Zacharias Kunuk about the 18th-century conflict between Cree and Inuit, which lasted almost a century.

Catherine Bainbridge is the co-founder, executive producer, and VP of business and creative development at Rezolution Pictures. She directed the Emmy-nominated, Sundance and CSA award-winning feature doc, RUMBLE: The Indians Who Rocked the World, and co-directed the Peabody and CSA award-winning feature doc, Reel Injun. Catherine is also an executive producer on the Crave Original series, Little Bird. Through her work at Rezolution, Catherine has been instrumental in changing the narrative when it comes to diversity and representation in the entertainment industry.


Three young reporters get into a car for a journey that will change their lives forever.

In the year following the terrorist attacks of 9/11, young journalist Claude Baechtold finds himself in the war zone of Afghanistan. Equipped with a video camera he bought at a bazaar in Kabul, he follows them for two months on a daring journey. Matt was a production assistant at "Jimmy Kimmel Live!" while Greg worked at "The Late Late Show with James Corden."

They decided to explore their experiences as identical twins through a documentary, which became ROMANO TWINS, their first feature film.

Star Search. in the stand-up comedy category. He was cast to play Joe (originally named Rick) on the American television. sitcom. News Radio, but was fired and replaced with. Greg Lee. in the pilot and then. Joe Rogan. for the rest of the show. He then appeared on. Late Show with David Letterman. doing his stand-up routine which formed his ties with. CBS. Shortly thereafter, he became the star of his own show, Everybody Loves Raymond. on. CBS, that featured a cast and format more suitable to Romano's brand of humor. His work on the series earned him six. Primetime Emmy Award. nominations as Outstanding Lead Actor in a Comedy Series, a category he won in 2002. He also shared two Emmy Awards as an executive producer when his show won as Outstanding Comedy Series in 2003 and 2005.





She was also an active member of the Everglades Foundation's High School Leadership Committee as well as interning with the Frost Science Museum through a program with the Smithsonian as an Ambassador representing the Museum of the American Latino in Washington, D.C.

Chloe seeks to engage with women who are actively involved in conservation activities throughout the watershed to better understand the water challenges we are now facing. Everglades National Park represents only a fraction of the entire Everglades system that also includes the various waterways that lead through the Kissimmee River Basin, Lake Okeechobee, the Southern Everglades and Florida Bay.

MARIAH REED directs plays and teaches voice and acting classes at Broward College where she is a tenured theatre faculty member and the recipient of three Endowed Teaching Chair awards. One of Mariah's assignments brought her to Florida where she founded New River Repertory and The Drama Center. 
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Dear Friends and Film Enthusiasts,

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
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
